Learning Disability: Identification and Intervention in Young Children

It is quite common today for children to begin school as early as two and a half years of age. There is little explicit consensus in philosophies and practices of schools on what is considered essential during the preschool and early school years to enable optimal development of academic learning abilities. Children with vulnerabilities to develop specific learning disability demonstrate many early signs of the same. It is important that professionals working with young children (Two and a half to ten years of age) are well-versed with identification of the signs accurately as well as appropriate intervention for the same. It is now well-established that a 'response-to-intervention' model is very useful to accurately identify various kinds of strategies for children with various kinds and degrees of vulnerabilities. This workshop has been designed to provide an academic and experiential exposure to the participants on the above.

- 1. Theoretical frameworks relevant for early academic learning with specific focus on children aged 2 ½ to 6 years
- 2. Practice frameworks for early identification of children vulnerable to develop specific learning disability

- 4. Practice frameworks for early intervention with children vulnerable to develop specific learning disability
