Three Months Certificate Course

in

Social Work in Community Mental Health (3rd Batch)

About the Course:

India is a nation with 1.33 billion inhabitants with 70% of them are rurally located. According to mental health survey 2015-16 the overall weighted prevalence for any mental illness was 13.7% lifetime and 10.6% current mental morbidity (Murthy, 2017). Mental illnesses constitute one-sixth of all health-related disorders and India accounts for nearly 15% of the global mental, neurological and substance abuse disorder burden. And to cater to the mental health needs of India, we have less than 4,000 mental health professionals (Psychiatrist, Psychiatric Social Workers, Clinical Psychologist and Psychiatric Nurses) directly dealing with mental illness in India (Grag, 2019). With the existing > 70% treatment gap in rural India (Patel, 2016) it is important to add more and more community mental health workers by giving adequate mental health training and supervision in the community mental health setting.

The community mental health training for social workers includes the following:

- 1) Education about common and severe mental health condition
- 2) Psycho-social assessment of people with mental illness and their families and training in providing appropriate psycho-social intervention
- 3) Home visit and psycho-social assessment and intervention for people with mental illness
- 4) Community Resource mapping and effective utilization of community resources for psycho-social intervention
- 5) Community awareness program for preventive, promotive mental health activities
- 6) Social Group Work and Case Work in community

- 7) School and College Mental Health Program
- 8) Industrial mental health program with detailed session by session methodologies
- 9) Preparation and demonstration of various Community based IEC materials various preventive and promotional mental health activities
- 10) Assessment of Psychosocial determinants of mental health through village visits.

This certificate course aims to equip the social work post graduates with the knowledge and skills on community mental health and to develops the manpower resources within social work discipline in the fields of community mental health by enhancing the capacities of the persons interested in working in the field of community mental health through education, assignments, demonstrations, interactive sessions, field visits and discussions. The candidates will be provided with the reading materials for their reference. The candidates will receive the training from various multidisciplinary team experts' community mental health units.

Multidisciplinary team experts:

The course candidates will be primarily supervised by faculties of psychiatric social work however, they will also be mentored by other multidisciplinary team members i.e. faculty from Department of clinical psychology, Department Psychiatry, Department of Nursing etc. The multidisciplinary mentoring will help the candidates to enhance their knowledge on holistic care community mental health services.

Structure of the course:

- 1. The candidates will be selected based on the eligibility criteria prescribed below.
- 2. Candidates will be mentored by the multidisciplinary team of community mental health services
- 3. Candidates will be exposed to various psychiatric social work services inside the NIMHANS campus as well as community-based services and programs.
- 4. Candidates are expected to participate in academic programs, clinical rounds, In-patient and out-patient clinical services, and community-based programs.
- 5. Candidates are expected to produce course log book and course assignments prior to the completion of the course.
- 6. Candidates will be given certificate on the successful completion of the course.

Content of the course:

- 1. Concept, dynamics, types, characteristics and functions of community
- 2. Community participation and education (different models of community participation)
- 3. Competency and skills required for community social worker in mental health
- 4. Community organization
- 5. Community treatment approaches
- 6. Various community based assessment and intervention
- 7. Preventive, promotive and curative aspects of mental health in community
- 8. Community Based Rehabilitation,
- 9. Self Help group movement and people with mental illness
- 10. Supported employment and industrial mental health
- 11. School and college mental health with life skill education approach
- 12. Understanding and utilizing social supports in the community
- 13. Conducting mental health camps in various community

14. case management and assertive community treatment

15. Role of voluntary social service organizations, involvement of community stakeholders and action groups for advocacy and social action

Future directions:

There is significant need of trained manpower in the field of mental health in India. The created man power will enable to early detection/identification of mental health issues with in the community and will be able to provide appropriate referral services or community-based intervention. The trained professional can bridge gaps between various mental health services/ treatment to people in need of it. It can also reduce the rate of hospitalization. NIMHANS being the Institute of National Importance and having pioneered in community mental health services, the course will benefit social workers who are keen to work in the field of community mental health. We are hopeful and we will strive for extension of this course to the SAARC countries on successful completion of this course for next one or two years.

Eligibility:

 The course is open to those who have obtained Master's Degree in Social Work (full time), from a University recognized by UGC and approved by NIMHANS, securing not less than 55% marks in the aggregate of the Master's Degree as a whole.

 Direct candidates, those deputed from other organizations and sponsored candidates from State/Central government /Armed forces/Other NGO's can be admitted to the course.

Duration

: Three Months full-time, on-campus @ NIMHANS.

Number of Seats

: Maximum 8 per intake in every batch.

• Fee Payable

: Rs.9000/- payable on selection (non-refundable, for three months)

- 3. Preference will be given for candidates who are working in community mental health services
